

# 66 CORE VALUES" JULY-AUGUST 2009

"The Spirit of the Sovereign LORD is on me, because the LORD has anointed me to preach good news to the poor. He has sent me to bind up the brokenhearted, to proclaim freedom for the Captives and release from darkness for the prisoners, [2] to proclaim the year of the LORD's favor and the day of vengeance of our God, to comfort all who mourn, [3] and provide for those who grieve in Zion-to bestow on them a crown of beauty instead of ashes, the oil of gladness instead of mourning, and a garment of praise instead of a spirit of despair. They will be called oaks of righteousness, a planting of the LORD for the display of his splendor. [4] They will rebuild the ancient ruins and restore the places long devastated; they will renew the ruined cities that have been devastated for generations. [5] Aliens will shepherd your flocks; foreigners will work your fields and vineyards. [6] And you will be called priests of the LORD, you will be named ministers of our God. You will feed on the wealth of nations, and in their riches you will boast. [7] Instead of their shame my people will receive a double portion, and instead of disgrace they will rejoice in their inheritance; and so they will inherit a double portion in their land, and everlasting joy will be theirs." - Isaiah 61:1-7

#### INDEPENDENCE DAY!

You may be thinking, "Boy, Pastor Dan, you sure did put a lot of scripture at the top of this page! And haven't you written pieces from this passage before?" I think you would be right on both counts. But I am going this way anyway, not because I am too lazy to write another long column or come up with something more original. Besides, God's Word is sharper than any twoedged sword and always speaks to our hearts.

No, here is why I am quoting this passage. First of all, it is the passage Jesus read from to announce His public ministry in Luke chapter four. Secondly, it spells out our mission and identity as a church. It is just over one year since we made the move to the new church building and changed our name to New Beginnings Wesleyan Fellowship, and we can proclaim, as Jesus did, that our mission is to do what He did as we introduce people to the redeeming work He accomplished on the cross for us which brings not only forgiveness for sins and eternal life, but a fresh start every day in the life we enjoy on earth. We are to bind up the broken-hearted, bring freedom to those who are captive to sin and addictive behaviors, and shine the light of God's Word into the darkness of hearts as yet unreached by God's love. We are to proclaim the favor of God on His beloved, the truth of His judgment with a promise of redemption for believers. We are to bring comfort to those who suffer loss and help those who have experienced defeat in life to find joy, beauty and purpose in life. In short, we are to help people find that a relationship with Jesus Christ brings new hope, new life and new beginnings.

In the past few days, I have finished our annual statistical reporting to the denomination (which I think you all know is not my favorite thing to do in life), and in looking back over the last year it has been a joy to see that besides recognizing our purpose, we can also claim promises that are listed in this passage of scripture. Earned or not, our church at one time had a reputation outside these walls as being a group sometimes at odds with itself and sometimes not very unified or welcoming. But we are

steadily gaining a witness as a body who strives and overcomes together, bears with one another and seeks to offer grace, forgiveness and love to all. We have been blessed in that some who were not even a part of our fellowship a short year ago are dearly loved additions to our church family and finding ways to serve God in the work of His church. We have seen numerous salvations and recommitments to Christ. And as I look at our financial report for this past year, I see that not only has God been faithful to meet our needs, but obviously His people have been faithful to be His vessels in doing so. In spite of the tumultuous economy, this group of servants have met the challenge of rising utilities and insurance costs, kept up with rising operational costs and still increased our outreach, upped our education and ministry funding, raised our level of giving to missions and stayed current on a \$24,000 a year payment on our new facilities. Our worship attendance is up, we were blessed with a new parsonage, and a new church is now worshipping in our old facility providing new outreach into the Hispanic population here and a double portion of God's love is made available through the church plant on our old campus and here in our new church. We are indeed blessed!

As we prepare to celebrate again the birth of our country and the independence from tyrannical rule we enjoy, let us be mindful of the great Independence Day we have experienced when on the cross Jesus Christ broke the shackles of sin we wore. Remember your chains and remember your chains are gone! And let us always remember those still living in those chains whom He has called us to bring freedom to. Pray that as God is blessing us, we will find new ways to bless others that they may see the splendor of Christ and know the truth that will set them free! To paraphrase a popular song, "Let Freedom ring, let the white dove sing . . . roll the stone away, it's Independence Day!
